Guidelines and Mechanics

ESCODA ON THE SPOT ESSAY WRITING CONTEST

1. The contest is open to all registered Senior/Cadet Girl Scouts throughout the Philippines. The Council must ensure that contestants are registered Senior and Cadet Girl Scouts at the time of the contest.
2. The essay must be original and must expound on the theme that will focus on the life and legacy of the GSP Founder.
3. The theme of the essay will be given before the essay.
4. Essay must be written in English and contestants will be given an hour to write their essays.
5. All entries must be handwritten in two pieces of intermediate pad paper or short bond paper (not back to back).
6. The contestant will be assigned a specific number. Her real name will be submitted to the coordinator in a sealed envelope.
7. Councils and regional offices will form their respective board of judges. Councils will submit three best essays to their respective regional offices. The regional offices will then select three best entries from among the council's essays and submit these to the GSP National Headquarters on or before September 30, 2014.
8. The criteria for judging are:

Content and Relevance to the theme	-	50%
Originality/Creativity	-	30%
Form and Style	-	20%
9. The prizes for the Council level are: All entries will be given a badge and certificate. For 1st – 3rd Prize – medal and NES gift certificate.
Prizes for National Level: First Prize – P20,000.00; Second Prize – P15,000.00; Third Prize – P10,000.00 and a medallion.
10. The decision of the Board of Judges is FINAL.
