



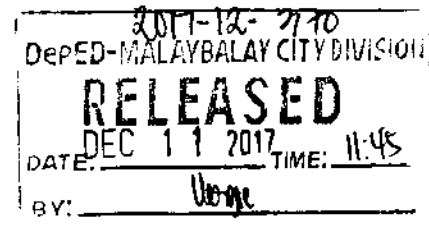

**Subject: Institutionalization of the ALS Summer Learning Camp**

In line with the DepED Region X's commitment to achieve the Education For All (EFA) goals and in pursuit of its priority programs and projects, the Alternative Learning System Division has designed the ALS Summer Learning Camp, an activity during summer to address the pressing problems of the populace especially the non-literates on Reading and other educational deficiencies. The implementation was multi-component, targeting replication and showcasing of best practices in teaching reading, writing, numeracy and core life skills.

After three (3) consecutive years (2010-2012) of the ALS Summer Learning Camp implementation, it has gained consensus and remarkable feedback that has brought many positive results based on the focused group discussions and interviews conducted by the EPS, DALSCs and MTs to the learners, parents and the community stakeholders. It has enhanced basic literacy skills through various literacy activities, honed the capabilities and competencies of Instructional Managers/Facilitators in teaching Reading and strengthened partnerships and support to the programs.

Thus, after a thorough evaluation of the program, and through the strong and unanimous recommendation of the fourteen (14) divisions of DepED Region X, the annual ALS Summer Learning Camp is Institutionalized and is now part of the annual strategic plan of action.

Immediate and widest dissemination of this Memorandum is desired.

## **GUIDELINES ON THE CONDUCT OF THE ANNUAL ALS SUMMER LEARNING CAMP**

In support to the Regional Memo No. 45 s. 2013, "Institutionalization of the ALS Summer Learning Camp," all divisions of DepED Region X will conduct the annual camp activity for a period of six to seven weeks, embracing the theme "Restore and Protect Ecosystem of Northern Mindanao Through Lifelong Learning," a season activity that will start on the second week of April of each year through the month of May and end on the third week. The activities in the whole region that will run for seven (7) weeks is an integrated approach with various learning opportunities that will surely enhance the reading competencies and lifelong learning skills of each participants. It mainly addresses the existing problems on reading deficiencies of ALS Learners, Social Issues and Environmental awareness.

The aforementioned activity aims to:

- a. increase awareness on social and environmental issues and come up with a common united efforts to address the concerns;
- b. demonstrate competence in reading and core life skills;
- c. showcase best practices, talents and skills Olympics;
- d. recognize and strengthen participation in community development program,

Expenses relative to the conduct of this activity will be charged to local funds, subject to the existing government accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

The issuance of these guidelines aim to provide specific and focused activities to the ALS Field Implementers in coordination with the LGUs and other community leaders, that relevant and responsive strategies to the pressing need of the learners and the community will be utilized as well and to ensure the efficient and effective program implementation of the 2012 ALS Summer Learning Camp.

### **1. Preparatory Activities**

The EPS-I in-charge of ALS shall conduct advocacy and orientation on the objectives of the program, the process and the activities suggested on the conduct of the Summer Learning Camp to the Mobile Teachers (MTs), District ALS Coordinators (DALSCs), Service Providers and LGUs in coordination with the Regional ALS Chief and DepED Officials.

- 1.1 MTs and DALSCs shall likewise advise to advocate and orient the AGAP Volunteers, BP-OSA Implementers, IMs, Literacy Facilitators, LGUs and others stakeholders in the district level to ensure gainful support and effective program implementation.
- 1.2 Lead implementers shall invite and tap expertise of community-based GOs/Individuals to handle topics that are highly technical, e.g., Disaster Preparedness & Survival, HIV Awareness & Prevention, and Citizenship Training etc.

## **2. Implementation Activities**

- 2.1 The annual Summer Learning Camp shall be simultaneously conducted starting on the second week of April through the month of May, to culminate on the 3<sup>rd</sup> week.
- 2.2 The theme of the activity will be provided, varying each year in accordance with the trends prevalent with the national scene and the needs of the times.
- 2.3 All ALS Learners (previous and recent), completers, A&E Passers and all ALS implementers shall participate in the activity.
