STRENGTHENING ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS

To: Undersecretaries

- 1. In view of the pressing global concerns and issues on the environment, the Department of Education (DepEd) urges all public and private schools to lead the role on environmental awareness by enhancing environmental education and by pursuing effective school-based activities that seek to preserve and protect the environment. This is in pursuant to Republic Act (R.A.) No. 9512, entitled "An Act to Promote Environmental Education and for Other Purposes."
- 2. Towards this end, all public and private schools shall undertake the following activities:
 - a. Intensifying lessons regarding environment on all science subjects. Environmental concerns shall also be used as tools for classroom drills, discussions and activities and shall be taught and be integrated in the related learning areas;
 - b. Encouraging the school administrators, officials and teachers to use various instructional materials such as books, visual aids, teaching guides and materials in making the students aware of the concerns and issues on the environment which shall promote students' participation in environmental activities and advocacies and instill in their minds the need to preserve and protect the environment;
 - e. Encouraging the teachers to attend lecture-seminars, workshops, conferences and other forums relating to environmental education which may be considered in their application for promotion;
 - d. Establishing the Youth for Environment in School Organizations (YESO) pursuant to DepEd Order No. 72, s. 2003 by all public and private elementary (Grades IV-VI) and secondary schools; and

- e. Establishing, registering, monitoring and evaluating the YES-O and other related organizations, which shall be under the administration and supervision of the DepEd's Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (CSCA); hence, regular reports shall be submitted by the CSCA to the Undersecretary for Programs and Projects, Undersecretary for Regional Operations and Undersecretary for Legal and Legislative Affairs.
- 3. The Guidelines in the Establishment and Organization of Youth for Environment in Schools-Organizations (YES-O) is enclosed.
- 4. The Bureau of Elementary Education (BEE), Bureau of Secondary Education (BSE) and Bureau of Alternative Learning System (BALS) shall integrate environmental education including issues and concerns in their review of existing curricula.
- 5. This DepEd Order shall take effect immediately upon issuance.
- 6. Immediate dissemination of and compliance with this Order is directed.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE YOUTH FOR ENVIRONMENT IN SCHOOLS (YES) ORGANIZATION

To: Undersecretaries Assistant Secretaries Bureau Directors Regional Directors Schools Division/City Superintendents Heads, Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools

- Relative to the holding of the 2003 Youth for Environment Summer (YES) Camp last April 30-May 4, 2003, one of the concrete resolutions and actions adopted by the entire delegration from all over the country is the establishment of a school-based co-curricular organization which will serve as a significant venue for students' actions and movements toward safeguarding, protecting and conserving the environment for future generations.
- In view thereof, the Department of Education (DepED), in partnership with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), establishes the Youth for Environment in Schools Organization (Yes-O) as the only recognized co-curricular environmental club or organization in the schools and consolidates all other environmental and/or ecology clubs or oganizations in school with main and primary programs or projects for the environment or ecology in the said Organization.
- The Youth for Environment in Schools (YES) Organization shall have the following objectives:
 - a. Be aware and create awareness in others of the state of the Philippine environment and ecology, including prevailing issues and concerns relative
 - b. Establish specific and doable programs, projects and activities to address issues and concerns on the environment and ecology;
 - Network with other government and non-government organizations, including C. Youth for Environment in Schools (YES) Organizations in other schools within the division and region, with regard to support and assistance to programs, projects and activities of the organization;
 - d. Encourage community participation and initiative in environmental and ecological movements and actions; and
 - Develop among members and the community proper environmental values. €. skills and attitudes.

4. The following programs, projects and activities may form part of the regular undertaking of the Youth for Environment in Schools (YES) Organization:

a. Clean-Up Drive inside and surrounding the school premises, including public and common areas in the community

b. Waste Management, Segregation and Recycling Program

 Awareness Campaigns to Address Specific Issues such as Pollution, Sanitation and Health

d. Symposia/Trainings

e. Nursery Establishment and Tree-Planting Activities

f. Fun Run for the Environment

g. Youth for Environment Summer Camp

5. All Regional Directors, Schools Division Superintendents and School Principals/Heads are ancouraged to organize, support and cooperate in the establishment and strengthening of the Youth for Environment in Schools (YES) Organization in their respective areas of jurisdiction and schools. Their support to the Youth for Environment Summer (YES) Camp in all levels as a major activity of the YES+O is hereby encouraged.

- 6. The Regional and Division Education Supervisors in Science, as Regional and Division Coordinators respectively, shall lead, coordinate and monitor the conduct of activities pertinent to the YES Organization in their respective areas of jurisdiction. The Science Department Head/Coordinator and Teacher, herein designated as School-Based Moderator and Assistant School-Based Moderator respectively, shall lead and operationalize the YES activities in the school level with the guidance of the School Head/Principal.
- 7. In the operationalization of the YES-O, coordination with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), particularly the DENR Regional Youth Desk Officers and other offices, is encouraged.
- 8. The DepED Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (CSCA), headed by Mr. Joey G. Pelaez, is tasked to oversee, coordinate and supervise the establishment and all activities of the YES Organization. - 9. Enclosed is the Constitution and By-Laws of the YES Organization.
