- The Office of the President through the Dangerous Drugs Board (DDB), in collaboration with the Department of Education (DepEd) through the Health and Nutrition Center (HNC), will conduct the Search for the Outstanding Barkada Kontra Droga (BKD) Chapters in Schools for School Year 2013-2014. Enclosed is a copy of the guidelines and implementing rules for the Search.
- 2. The Search aims to:
 - a. strengthen the National Drug Education Program (NDEP) through the BKD movement established in the schools;
 - b. develop skills and understanding among students, faculty and school administrators in initiating active responses for a drug-free school:
 - community awareness and participation; hence, c. increase maintaining a fully drug-free environment in the school, home, workplace and community;
 - d. support and sustain the services in the Barkada-adopted concepts among educators, professionals, families, work forces, peer groups and other sectors; and
 - e. identify best practices of the different BKD Chapters, which will serve as models for other schools to implement.
- All secondary schools with an established BKD Chapter are encouraged to join the Search.

SEARCH FOR THE OUTSTANDING BARKADA KONTRA DROGA (BKD) CHAPTERS IN THE SCHOOLS School Year 2013-2014

RATIONALE:

- The Office of the President through the Dangerous Drugs Board issued Board Regulation No. 5, Series of 2007, entitled "Institutionalizing the Barkada Kontra Droga Program". This is in compliance to Section 77, Art. IX of RA 9165 otherwise known as the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002.
- Series of launching seminars were conducted as a preventive education and information program and has evolved a nationwide "Barkadahan" concept—a collective action among the students, the youth and the people in the community that would strengthen camaraderie, collaboration, cooperation, solidarity and linkages in their common commitment to attain a drug-free lifestyle wherever they may be.
- Alternative activities are undertaken after the launching of the program in the schools and in the community. These activities are preventive education and information program to counter the dangers and disastrous effects of drug abuse.

II. OBJECTIVES:

A. General:

• To encourage schools/academic institutions to become more actively involved in promoting people empowerment in leading a healthy lifestyle that is drug-free and productive.

B. Specific:

- Strengthen the National Drug Education Program (NDEP) through the Barkada Kontra Droga movement established in the schools;
- Develop skills and understanding among students, faculty and school administrators in initiating active responses for a drug free school;
- Maintain a fully drug-free environment in the school, nome, workplace and community.
- Support and sustain the services in the "Barkada" adopted concepts among educators, professionals, families, work forces, peer groups and other sectors;
- Identify best practices of the different BKD Chapters which will serve as model for other chapters to implement;

III. INPLEMENTING RULES:

• Who can participate

The Search for the Best BKD Chapter is open to all secondary schools with established BKD Chapter nationwide

Period of coverage

The search will be conducted from July 2013-March 2014 (SY 2013-2014)

There will be two preliminary searches to be conducted at two levels as follows:

- 1. Division Level The search will be conducted from July to November by the Division Evaluating Theme. The winner will be submitted to the Regional Evaluating Theme
- 2. Regional Level The search on the regional level will be done from December to January.

Judges/Evaluation team

The decision of the Board of Judges to be composed of noted individuals from government and non-government sectors at the regional and national levels, shall be final and unappealable.

Awards and prizes

There will be one (1) regional finalist and three (3) national winners: namely 1^{a} Prize, 2^{aa} Prize and 3^{cd} Prize. Regional winners shall compete at the National Level.

Winners at the National Level will be announced and awarded during the celebration of the Drug Abuse Prevention and Control (DAPC) Week on the 2nd week of November 2014.

Supmission of entries

All entries should be submitted directly to their respective DepEd Division Onices for the Division Level Search. Deadline of entries will be on or before November 15, 2013.

Winners in the Division Level will be submitted to their respective Regional Evaluating Theme on or before December 01, 2013.

The regional winner should be submitted to the Dangerous Drugs Board on or before January 15, 2014.

Screening of entries

Selected entries will then be submitted to the Dangerous Drugs Board, the National Secretariat of the BKD.

Requirements

Participating schools are required to fill up an entry form for the Search.

Supporting documents properly endorsed by the School Authorities and should consist of all the materials that show evidence of the school's BKD activities and programs. It can include the following:

- Memoranda, circulars, special orders
- Photos of BKD activities and programs of the school
- Publications of drug related activities
