In order to identify and have a pool of competent and highly qualified superintendent aspirants and in an effort to raise the level of excellence among educational leaders and managers, the EMT Executive Committee methodically deliberated and resolved all the qualifications enumerated in DepEd Order No. 88, s. 2012.

Inasmuch as the Department would like to consider your appeal to waive the eligibility requirements particularly, the qualifications that an applicant "must be a Career Executive Service Eligible (CESE), Career Service Executive Eligible (CSEE), and passers of the Career Executive Officers (CEO) Examination" and the "five years experience in administration and instructional supervision with a salary Grade of at least P3 (SG 21)", we are compelled to do otherwise. In all government examinations, including those administered by the Civil Service Commission (CSC) and Professional Regulatory Commission (PRC), specific requirements are established and strictly followed.

It is unfortunate that some aspirants will fail to meet the requirements set forth in the DepEd Order despite their accomplishments and contributions in the field of education. However, the Department has to stick to its highest standards for purposes of fairness and professionalism.
