



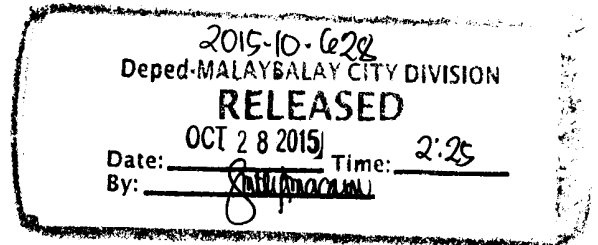



Greetings!

Amidst the societal decay and the corruption of their minds prevailing due to mass media, environmental and peer influences, and other factors affecting their behavioral patterns; our youth of today need proper guidance and direction. The continuing influence posed an alarming consequence that has a great impact of our societal characters.

We the Council for Restoration of Filipino Values (CRFV), envisions a community marked with a character of an honest and righteous environment geared towards a graft free society. For us to succeed, we enjoin all sectors of government officials and employees to actively participate in eradicating graft and corruption practices as well as combating all social ills with an aim to uphold righteousness, code of conduct and ethical standards in the workplace geared with the eradication of graft and corruption.

A study of the University of the Philippines Population Institute (UPPI) shows that premarital sex among the youth rose to 32 percent from 18 percent in 1994. The percentage continued to increase in 2013, which 6.2 million Filipino youth had engaged in premarital sex and more than half of this number — 4.8 million young people — indulged in unprotected sex. In addition, a nationwide survey, revealed serious problems in the areas of criminality, gambling and sexuality among Filipino youths. This data shows an alarming state of our youth today that may even worsen in the future.

Studies showed statistics on the different variables that out of 21 million Filipino youth;

- 50% are smokers
- 4.7 million have been drunk
- 30% of them are under the influence of drugs
- 1.7 have used drugs
- 4 million have seen pornography materials
- 2.7 % are in prison
- 60% of them believe that they are immune to AIDS
- 1.7 have been raped
- 30% of women prefer to be men, 28 % of men prefer to be women
- 48 % say that there is no way to tell which religion is true
- 33 % believe that truth is relative

Is this the generation that Rizal had conceptualized as future leaders of this nation?

As role models and guide, in making their dream to what God fashioned them to be, we must take responsibility. As the saying states, "Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it". The future of the next generations to come is dependent to a partnership in order to make this a reality. With this goal, we want to partner with you to make this realistic by inspiring

I. RATIONALE

Dr. Jose P. Rizal believed that the youth is the hope of the Fatherland and charged the young people of his generation to take heed of the call to serve the nation at all cost. The Book of Ecclesiastes admonishes us to "remember the Lord our God in the days of our youth", while Saint Paul encourages his protégé Timothy to not let anyone despise his youth but to set an example of faith, love, and wisdom.

YLEAD espouses all policies provided by R.A. 8044, or the "Youth in Nation Building Act", specifically "inculcation in the youth of patriotism, nationalism, and other basic desirable values to infuse them faith in the Creator, belief in the sanctity of life and dignity of the human person, conviction for the strength and unity of the family and adherence to truth and justice".

SUBJECT : Implementation of Values Restoration Program
