2015 NATIONAL READING MONTH

Undersecretaries. To: Assistant Secretaries Bureau Directors Directors of Services, Centers and Heads of Units Regional Directors Schools Division Superintendents Heads, Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools All Others Concerned

- The Department of Education (DepEd) will lead the whole nation in the celebration of the 2015 National Reading Month (NRM), with the theme Nasa Pagbasa ang Pag-asa this November.
- 2. The Celebration aims to:
 - a. support the Ten-Point Agenda of the Aquino Administration;
 - b. commemorate the birth anniversary of the late Senator Benigno "Ninoy" Aquino on November 27, and celebrate his ardent love for reading; and
 - c. promote the DepEd's Every Child A Reader Program making the Filipino learners a generation of readers.
- All school officials and learning center administrators are enjoined to conduct activities detailed in the enclosure for elementary and secondary school learners. However, schools are also encouraged to hold the related activities other than those from the list in their respective schools divisions or schools.
- The NRM shall culminate with the nationwide synchronized story reading time on November 27, 2015, 9:00 a.m. Philippine Standard Time (PST).
- Pictorial report of the activities done during the month long celebration is expected to be posted in www.facebook.com/arawngpagbasa while a full regional narrative report shall be sent via email to arawngpagbasa2015@gmail.com and spapo@gmail.com not later than December 15, 2015.

SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES FOR THE NATIONAL READING MONTH

Mystery Reader. A national kick-off activity where all schools administrators, Schools Division Superintendents, and Regional Directors are directed to be mystery readers of a children's Filipino story book during the school's flag raising ceremony.

Magbasa Tayo. Learners from the upper grade partner with those from the lower grade. At a designated time and place, the learner from the upper grade will read a story to his/her partner; or at times, both will read a story together.

Libro Ko Handog Ko Upon registration to the Reading Olympics, participants and guests will donate astory book written by a Filipino author. Books from this activity shall be turned over to school libraries and the District ALS Coordinator as ALS learners as beneficiaries.

Reading Olympics. A week-long activity that will highlight the following activities:

- · Reader's Theater
- Reader's Hat (storybook reading)
- Book Talk (Story Telling)
- Trivial Pursuit (quiz bee for children's stories)
- My Own Story (short story writing that shares and features stories of hope)
- Read In! (Poster making contestion the value of reading).
- From Book to Film (video making contest featuring stones written by Filipino writers)
- ** This activity will feature Filipino literature including those stories about Filipino heroes.

Help a reader. Be a Volunteer. Schools and learning centers shall invite parents and other community volunteers to help the non-readers and other learners with reading difficulties by adopting a child and help him succeed in reading.

Reading Family. A symposium for parents and guardian on the importance of reading to their children at home and on helping their children become successful readers.

KaREADthon: On November 27, select mystery readers share a story of hope to the children in the chosen hospital where light of hope is needed. While those in school, will hold the Arawing Pagpasa Challenge.

Araw 29 Pagbasa Challenge. On November 27, all learners, teachers, school officials will do a he nationwide synchronized reading at exactly 9:00 am Philippine Standard Time (PST).

Parade of Characters. Schools shall hold a parade of book characters around the community with learners teachers, parents and other stakeholders holding their favorite Filipind story books and posters showing the importance for reading.
