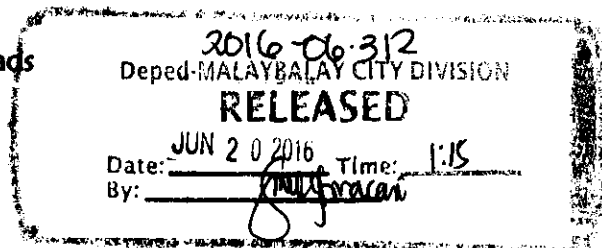



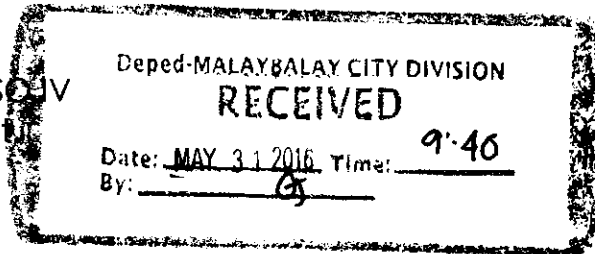

Project Title: **Education Towards Social Transformation: Educators Formation Program**

I. Program Description and Rationale

The Teresian Association Center for Culture and Spirituality in partnership with Bukidnon State University in Malaybalay City have been organizing every school year 4 seminars on Teachers' Formation in honor of 3 great educators St. Pedro Poveda, Blessed Victoria Diez and Venerable Josefa Segovia. It is for this reason that the seminars are scheduled on these months: July, August, October and December. They are held always on a Saturday when the students and teachers are free. The main objective of the program is to make teachers in the field and future teachers realize the important role they play in building the young to make a difference in society and to look forward for a better future. Hence, the seminars would focus on the skills necessary to be an effective teacher.

For the first year of existence (2012), the venue for the first three seminars were held in the Teresian Association for Center of Culture & Spirituality with members of the Teresian Association as speakers focusing on the educational trends, principles, skills as depicted by three great educators: St. Pedro Poveda, Blessed Victoria Diez and Venerable Josefa Segovia. Dr. Perla Palabrica was the first speaker. She expounded on the "Principles of Personalized Education according to St. Pedro Poveda". Dr. Belinda Villegas was the second speaker. She dwelt on the topic "Blessed Victoria Diez as a Teacher". Ms. Teresita Infante, the third speaker, focused on "Josefa Segovia, For She Loved Well". The last speaker for that year was Ms. Carmen Ll. Sayo who dwelt on the topic: "Build the Young, Strength of the World." Due to the increasing number of participants in every scheduled date, the last seminar that year was held in the auditorium of Bukidnon State University where the Teresian Association was so much welcomed by the BSU community.

Ms. Carmen Ll. Sayo the Project Coordinator saw the need for networking with the University whose concern was the formation of teachers. Three educators were tapped: Prof. Lora E. Añar, Prof. Albert A. Villanca and Prof. Mercedita S. Villamayor to form the team for the PROJECT: FORMATION OF EDUCATORS with Carmen Ll. Sayo, member of the Teresian Association as Coordinator. The project was so warmly welcomed by the BSU President at that time, Dr. Victor M. Barroso who gave the team the approval to network directly with the Dean of the College of Teacher Education, Dr. Beverly B. Bicar, as partners in this endeavor. This was sustained by the new administration through the leadership of Dr. Oscar B. Cabañez.

The Teachers' Formation Team saw the success of the first four seminars with a great number of participants either future teachers or teachers in the field from different institutions like, Bukidnon State University, San Isidro College (a Diocesan school), and

MATI (a vocational School), the project continued and need to be sustained. The team saw the need of spreading the seminars outside of the university, to reach out to DepEd teachers and private school teachers who need to be refreshed and provided assistance from the tasks and challenges they face in school. They need the opportunities to grow personally and professionally.

The program aims to provide a venue for the participants to enhance their knowledge, attitudes, skills and habits (KASH) in the teaching learning processes.

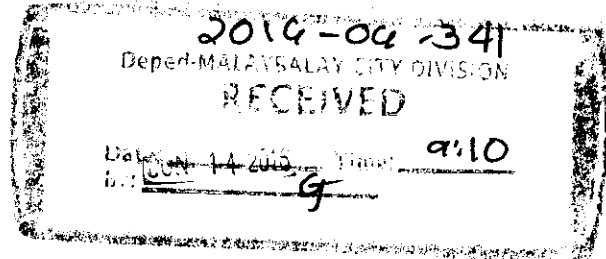
Specifically, this program aims to:
