Subject: Observance of the Fire Prevention Month

- 1. Pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 115-A which declared March of every year as Fire Prevention Month and DepED Order No. 72, s. 2012 re: Continuing Fire Safety and Awareness Program (FSAP) in Schools, all concerned are directed to do the following:
 - a. conduct Fire exit drill on March 10, 2016 (Thursday),
 - b. conduct fire safety education to students, and

- 2. Furthermore, School DRRM Coordinators should submit three Fire Exit Drill Evaluation Forms fully filled out and signed by three different evaluators to this Office attention: Project Development Officer II (DRRM) Jimdandy S. Lucine not later than March 18, 2016 (Friday).
- 3. Expenses incurred in the printing of tarpaulin will be charged against the School's MOOE.



PRACTICE ESCAPE ROUTES

In school or at home, it is very important that all students or family members should know where to exit in the event of a fire.



PUT OUT SMALL FIRES

If you know how to put out small fires, do so within the first two minutes.

When using fire extinguishers, just remember the acronym
PASS (Pull, Aim, Squeeze, and Sweep).



STOP, DROP, and ROLL

If your clothes catch fire, stay calm and don't run. Remember to stop, drop, and roll to put out the flame.



GET DOWN UNDER SMOKE

If there is smoke, get down and cover you mouth and nose with a wet towel or cloth, then find the safe exit and get out.



SOS GET OUT AND CALL FOR HELP

Don't hide, go outside! Never attempt to get back inside the burning house or building for any reason. Once outside, call the City's emergency hotlines for help.
