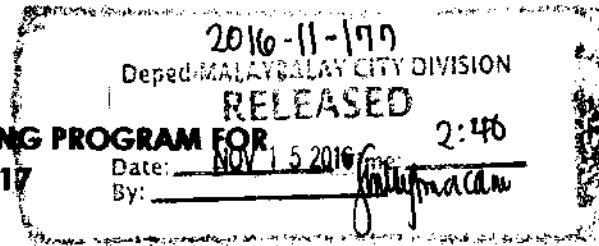

**ALLOCATION ON SCHOOL-BASED FEEDING PROGRAM FOR
SCHOOL-YEAR 2016-2017**



To: Chief Education Supervisors and staff- CID and SGOD
Schools Division Technical Working Group (SDTWG)
Public Elementary School Heads Concerned
All Others Concerned

1. In accordance to attached Unnumbered Regional Memorandum dated October 18, 2016, entitled Allocation On School-Based Feeding Program for SY 2016- 2017, this Office hereby directs all public elementary School Heads (SHs) concerned to implement SBFP covering 1,178 Severely wasted and Wasted learners.

2. The forty three (43) SBFP fund recipients are enjoined to complete the feeding days. Those schools which were delayed in the implementation, the Schools Heads concerned are advised to submit to this Office Letter Request for granting of vacation service credits to school personnel who have implemented SBFP related activities in excess of eight (8) hours work done in school premises, pursuant to DM No. 291 s. 2008, (Guidelines for CSC Resolution No. 080096 on Working Hours for Public School Teachers) and DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 entitled Updated Guidelines on Grant of Vacation Service Credits of Teachers.

3. In compliance to Paragraph No.5 of the said Regional Memorandum, Division Technical Working Group and Monitoring Team on SBFP shall monitor adherence of schools to SBFP guidelines, procurement process, health and nutritional assessment and conduct of complementary activities e.g. deworming, food production, integration of good grooming and personal hygiene. School Heads (SHs) shall monitor the DAILY feeding activities and ensure functionality of Gulayan sa Paaralan which will serve as the source of feeding ingredients

4. Immediate dissemination and strict compliance is desired.

- In schools divisions that started late in feeding, the schools are enjoined to continue feeding during weekends or during summer to complete the number of feeding days and fully utilized the allocated funds.

4. School Division Superintendents are authorized to approve the request for granting vacation service credits to DepEd school personnel who have implemented SBFP related activities in excess of eight (8) hours work done in school premises, with the recommendation of the School Head, pursuant to DM No. 291 s. 2008 (*Guidelines for the Implementation of CSC Resolution No. 080096 on Working Hours for Public School Teachers*) and DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 entitled *Updated Guidelines on Grant of Vacation Service Credits of Teachers*.
5. Per implementing guideline in D.O. 51, s. 2016, It is expected that the Division Technical Working Group (DTWG) shall have been created to monitor the school compliance with the guidelines procurement process, health and nutritional assessment and the conduct of complementary activities, such as deworming, food production, integration of good grooming and personal hygiene. School Heads (SHs) are expected to monitor the feeding activities and program implementation on a daily basis. Gulayan sa Paaralan shall be established and maintained as the source of ingredients for feeding.
6. To ensure an efficient and effective implementation of the program, it is advised that the added and amended specific provisions as stated in DepEd Order No. 62 s. 2016 be followed.
7. Immediate and wide dissemination of and strict compliance of this Memorandum is enjoined.
