

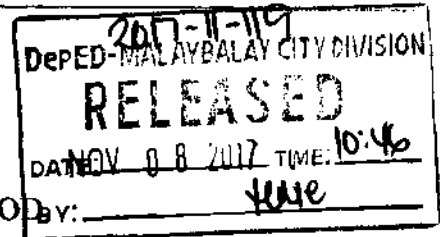

ENGLISH EXTRAVAGANZA AND READ-A-THON

To: Schools Division Superintendents
This Region

1. Pursuant to RA 10556 declaring every 27th day of November as National Reading Month, and in support of the Every Child A Reader Program (ECARP) and the Early Language Literacy and Numeracy (ELLN), this Office through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD) will conduct the 2017 English Extravaganza and Read-A-Thon on November 24, 2017. The activity serves as a culmination of the 2017 National Reading Month Celebration. The venue shall be announced in separate Memorandum.

2. The regional culmination shall include the following contests with the mechanics found in the enclosures:

3. Participants to this activity are the division winners of the different contests, coaches and Education Program Supervisors in English, CLMD Team in the Region. Due to fund constraints, the number of contests as agreed during the planning conference in April has been reduced, correspondingly, the distribution of participants is found in Enclosure 1



4. The Outstanding ELLN Initiatives and Innovations as one of the highlights in the regional culmination of the National Reading Month will anchor on the school implementation and innovations of the Early Child A Reader Program (ECARP) and Early Language Literacy and Numeracy Program (ELLN). The monitoring and evaluation team of the region shall visit the schools recommended by the Division ECARP/ELLN coordinators in the first week of November, 2017.

5. Expenses incurred such as supplies and materials, trophies and medals, honorarium of judges, plaques and cash awards shall be charged against regional MOOE and ELLN funds while travel and other related expenses of the participants shall be charged against local funds and any other available funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

CONTEST GUIDELINES

(Contestants may come from public and private schools)

GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. All individual contestants shall wear their school uniform.
2. Only one (1) entry will represent each school division certified by the coach.
3. The most important rule of all. Have fun. Relax, whether you are a participant or a spectator.

Poem Recitation (Grade I)

1. The piece shall be in English which shall be provided by the regional coordinator two (2) weeks before the regional contest.
2. This piece shall be memorized by the contestant to be delivered during the regional contest and which shall be judged according to this criteria:

Mastery	-	15 points
Interpretation	-	15 points
Overall Delivery	-	20 points
TOTAL	-	50 POINTS

3. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.

Story Book Retelling (Grade II)

1. Contestants shall be placed in one room as a holding area to listen to the Storyteller.
2. The Storyteller and the big book to be read will be arranged by the regional coordinator.
3. No coach or parent is allowed inside the storytelling room.
4. After listening to the story, the contestant is given 5-7 minutes to be with the coach for briefing and or instruction.
5. Points will be given based on the following criteria:

Mastery	-	15 points
Voice Projection	-	10 points
Vocal variety	-	10 points
On-stage performance	-	10 points
Fluency of the language	-	5 points
(eye contact, gestures, facial expression, emotional expression)		

TOTAL 50 points

Story Book Reading (Grade III)

1. Only one (1) contestant who is a Grade I learner certified by the coach shall represent the Division.
2. Contestants shall wear their school uniform.
3. Contestants shall be placed in one room as a holding area to read the Big Book by themselves in one (1) hour. The big book to be read will be provided by the management.



4. No coach or parent is allowed inside the holding area.
5. The contestant is given 5-7 minutes to tell the story using the Big Book provided.
6. Points will be given based on the following criteria:
 - Voice Projection - 15 points
 - Vocal variety - 15 points
 - On-stage performance - 15 points
 - Fluency of the language - 5 points
(eye contact, gestures, facial expression, emotional expression)

TOTAL 50 points

Spelling (Grade IV)

1. Contestants are advised to be at the venue at least 30 minutes before the start of the contest for the briefing/reminders from the committee.
2. Contestants shall bring tag board (4 x 12"), board eraser and white chalk for the contest.
3. The contest shall be facilitated by a committee composed of the following:
a. Arbiter b. Bee Master c. Time Keeper d. Checkers e. Tabulators
4. The American Heritage Dictionary shall be used as the official reference.
5. Top seven (7) will be declared winners with gold, silver and bronze medals for top three (3) and Certificate of Recognition for all the contestants.
6. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.

MECHANICS

1. The contest is done in 3 rounds: easy, average, and difficult. There shall be ten (10) words for every round.
2. The Bee Master will give the correct pronunciation of the word including its part of speech and definition. It shall be used in the sentence. The word is read twice.
3. Time allotment and points:
 - a) Easy Round - 5 seconds/word - 1 point/word
 - b) Average Round - 7 seconds/word - 2 points/word
 - c) Difficult Round - 10 seconds/word - 3 points/word
4. The contest shall follow the elimination system. Contestants who do not get half of the total points in the Easy Round shall not proceed to the Average Round nor Difficult Round.
5. Protests may be filed by anyone (the speller, parent, teacher, etc.) wishing to reinstate a speller into the contest but will not be heard from any individual seeking to dislodge another speller from the competition. Protests should be verbally made to a designated person upon completion of a round.
6. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable



Reading and Comprehension (Grade V)

1. All contestants shall be placed in a testing room along with the facilitators who will run the contest. No coaches are allowed inside the contest area.
2. The contest will run in one (1) hour.
3. Top seven (7) will be declared winners with gold, silver and bronze medals for the top three (3) winners, and certificate of recognition for all the contestants.
4. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.

Jazz Chant (Grade 8)

1. The group shall be composed of a maximum 10 members.
2. The piece shall be prepared by the group to focus on Advocacy of SHS learners to graduate in 2018, equipped with competencies to pursue careers based on 4 exits.
3. Presentation shall not be more than 5 minutes including entrance and exit.
4. Timekeeper is assigned to flash the following colors:
Yellow - 10 seconds entrance after the exit of the preceding group
Green - 3-5 minute delivery
Yellow - remaining 1 minute
Red - end of the presentation
5. No props allowed
6. Points will be given based on the following criteria:

a. Message	- 30%
b. Delivery	- 30%
c. Stress and Rhythm	- 20%
d. Creativity	- 10%
e. Overall Performance	- 10%
TOTAL	- 100%
7. Top 7 will be declared winners with gold, silver and bronze medals with trophies for top three (3) and certificate of recognition for all contestants.

Essay Writing (Grade 9)

1. All contestants shall be placed in a contest room along with the facilitators who will run the contest. No coaches are allowed inside the contest area.
2. The theme will be given by the contest facilitator.
3. The contest will run in one (1) hour.



4. Top seven (7) will be declared winners with gold, silver and bronze medals for the top three (3) winners, and certificate of recognition for all the contestants.
5. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.

Table Topics (Coach Category)

1. Contestants shall be from among the winning coaches during the division level.
2. The topic shall be given by the management during the contest proper.
3. Each contestant shall be given 5 minutes to organize the talk, before the actual delivery.
4. Contestants shall be judged according to this criteria:

Voice Projection	-	10 points
Content	-	20 points
Fluency of the language	-	15 points
Stage Performance	-	5 points
TOTAL		50 POINTS

Search for Outstanding ECARP Implementer (Elementary)

Search for Outstanding School-Based Functional Reading Program

(Secondary)

1. The contest is anchored on the initiatives and innovations of the schools to develop the love of reading and zero non-readers.
2. Each Schools Division shall recommend schools to be visited by the validating team from the Regional Office on the first second week of November, maximum of 10 schools in the elementary and 5 schools in the secondary.
3. The contest considers the school Storylandia or Reading Hub, Reading Corner and NAT.
4. Winners which are to be awarded on November 24, 2017 shall be announced in an Advisory.
5. Previous guidelines relative to the search remain to be observed.
