

3rd NATIONAL PEACETIVAL OF TALENTS AND VALTUES (VALUES AND VIRTUES)

THEME: "SHAPING PEACE, VALUES, AND VIRTUES AMIDST ADVERSITIES"
November 11-13, 2020

Rationale

APNIEVE-Philippines empowers individuals and institutions in promoting the values of Peace, Human Rights, Democracy, and Sustainable Development. It establishes networks and partnerships with local and international institutions interested in values education. It recognizes the crucial role of education.

Republic Act (RA) 11476 institutionalizing Good Manners and Right Conduct (GMRC) and Values Education as core subjects in the K to 12 curriculum both in public and private schools. It shall inculcate among our students the basic tenets of the observance of respect for oneself, others, and our elders, intercultural diversity, gender equity, ecology and integrity of creation, peace, and justice, obedience to the law, nationalism and global citizenship, as well as the values of patience, perseverance, industry, honesty, and integrity, and good faith in dealing with other human beings along with all other universal values. The new law mandates DepEd to carry out appropriate training for teachers and educators on GMRC and Values Education and provide them with adequate and relevant instructional materials to develop their capacity to teach the subject. The Department of Education (DepEd) shall introduce GMRC through clear, distinct, specific, and concrete character-building activities such as role-playing in the classroom, community immersion activities, teacher-parent collaborative learning activities, school-initiated values formation activities, simulated activities, and other forms of experiential learning

According to Regional Memorandum 137. S. 2018, dated August 30, 2018, stated the Regional Observance of the Filipino values Month. Presidential Proclamation 479 dated October 24, 1994, stipulates that the Filipino Values Month strengthen the moral resources of the Filipino rooted in Filipino culture, values, and ideals that are pro-God, pro-people, pro-country, and pronature, and thereby mobilizing all Filipinos for nation-building through the practical exercise of human values in our daily lives as citizens and to awaken us all to the power of these values in achieving our individual and national goals;

WHEREAS, the promotion and engendering of a sustained Moral Recovery Program may be further facilitated through a vigorous and coordinated campaign measures actively participated in by all sectors of Filipino society;

WHEREAS, the celebration of Filipino Values Month regularly is a desirable and effective measure to create moral awakening and national consciousness on human values that are unique, genuine, and positively Filipino.



WHEREAS DepEd Memorandum No.177 s. 2017 stipulates that the observance of Filipino Values Month in November of Every school year starting 2017-2018 and thereafter

GUIDELINES, MECHANICS AND CRITERIA FOR JUDGING LARAWAN NG PAGPAPAHALAGA CONTEST

A. Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. Participants must be bonafide students of a public or private elementary school (Grade 5 or Grade 6) in their respective division.
- 2. Contestants and coaches must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided.
- 3. For the elimination round, coaches must submit a video of the actual workshop or drawing of the participant on or before November 3, 2020 (please edit and compress it in 3 to 5 minutes).
- 4. The poster must illustrate, interpret, and emphasize the theme.
- 3. On the final round, Participants are given one and half hour to finish their poster live via zoom.
- 4. Each participant should submit ONE entry only.
- 5. The following materials will be used in the said contest:
 - a. A ¼ illustration board (white background & vertical format)
 - b. pencil
 - c. Coloring Material: Oil pastel/cray pas, markers, ink, mixed media, oil acrylic, and watercolor
 - d. Pentel pen and other drawing materials.
- 6. Posters must be done in freehand.
- 7. The artists and coaches will be held accountable for any issues that may arise regarding the originality and authenticity of the design.
- 8. The decision of the judges shall be final and non-appealable.

B. Criteria

- a. Relevance to the Theme- 30%
- b. Originality -25%
- c. Creativity -20%
- d. Color Harmony -15%
- e. Visual Impact -10%



KANTAHALAGA Contest

A. Guidelines and Mechanics:

- 1. Participants must be bonafide students of a public or private Junior High school in their respective division.
- 2. Contestants and coaches must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided.
- 3. The song should be in English or Tagalog or a combination of both, it must be Original Music, and copying of tune or lyrics from an existing song is PROHIBITED. The use of language should subscribe to the standard rules of decency.
- 4. Each song must not exceed 4 minutes. Every exceedingly second corresponds to one (1) point deduction from the total score. The student must be the one playing the instrument (Guitar or Keyboard)
- 5. Song must anchor the theme; the song composition must be the original composition of the participants (lyrics/message, musical arrangement), with the choice of the appropriate genre such as Pop, Jazz, Ballad, and Classical.
- 6. Words with registered trademarks/brand names, explicit and offensive lyrics are strictly not allowed.
- 7. All song entries (musical composition/arrangement) shall be considered FINAL once submitted, and cannot be modified or altered before the selection and announcement of winners
- 8. Deadline for submission of entries for the elimination will be on November 3, 2020.
- 9. Top 10 contestants will be notified on November 6, 2020. The finals will be on **November 10**, at 2 pm.
- 10. The judges' decision is final and irrevocable.

Virtual Spoken Poetry Contest

A. Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. Participants must be bonafide students of a public or private elementary school (Grade 5 or Grade 6) in their respective division.
- 2. Contestant and coach must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided.
- 3. For the elimination round, the participants will record his/her video of spoken poetry that is related to the theme "SHAPING PEACE, VALUES, AND VIRTUES AMIDST ADVERSITIES" and will not exceed to the time limit that has a maximum of 5 minutes. On the final round among top 10 participants will perform it live via zoom.
- 4. The spoken poetry must be an original composition. It could be written in English or Filipino and must be delivered from memory with movements or gestures related to the piece. The piece shall have the following specifications:
 - a. Font size is 12
 - b. Font Type Arial, Time New Roman, or Calibri
 - c. One-inch margin all sides
 - d. 1.5- line spacing and 0 pt. before and after
 - e. Stanzas are separated with one space in between.
- 5. Three (3) soft copies of the spoken poetry and the recorded video on or before November 3, 2020, must be submitted to the organizers
- 6. 2 participants per division 1 per grade, specifically 5-6

B. Criteria for Judging:

- 1. Content- 40%
- 2. Delivery and Performance- 20%
- 3. Convincing Aura- 10%
- 4. Originality- 20%
- 5. Attire- 10%



VALUES MONOGRAPH CONTEST

A. Guidelines and Mechanics

- 1. The contest is open to bonafide Junior High School in their respective Division.
- 2. The Value/Virtue is an impromptu discussion/presentation of values/virtues taken from the values clusters for an ethical theme, topics from the book of EsP 7-10, and DepEd Core Values.
- 3. There will be an elimination round and final round.
- 4. In the elimination round, a particular judge will ask each contestant via zoom about a certain idea or topic mention in number 2.
- 5. The contestants will be given three (3) minutes to prepare and three (3) minutes to present. The Filipino Language will be used as a medium in the presentation (discussion of Values/Virtues).
- 6. The presentation/discussion will focus on the content of value/virtue. It is relevant and applicable to the life of the student and the community in general.
- 7. In the final round, the top 10 contestants who are qualified will then present on the final round
- 8. The decision of the Judges shall be final and non-appealable.

A. Guidelines and Mechanics:

- 1. All participants must be bona fide students of a public or private Junior High school in their respective division.
- 2. Contestants and coaches must be duly endorsed by their respective superintendent using the Registration Form provided
- 3. Each Group will create a video using the TikTok app with a time limit of 45-60 seconds. Every exceedingly second corresponds to one (1) point deduction from the total score.
- 4. The gathering of the contestant in one place in order for them to shoot is not allowed.
- 5. Each group will have a maximum of three (3) members.
- 6. The members can be composed of all males or females, or any combination thereof.
- 7. The TikTok dance number must have an accompaniment of any music which is related to the theme.
- 8. The use of Appropriate sound (music, original, etc.) and clothing is a necessary. No profanity, no inappropriate language, inappropriate skit/dance/appearance, no inappropriate gestures, and no vulgar words are allowed.
- 9. The use of costumes and props is allowed.
- 10. The decision of the members of the board of judges is final and irrevocable.
