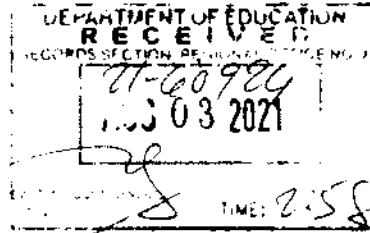

RPS 2021-06: Toward an Inclusive Social Insurance Coverage in the Philippines: Examining Gender Disparities
by Audrey D. Tubuga and Francis C. Domingo

The Philippines, a country prone to natural calamities and vulnerable to economic fluctuations, has much to accomplish in improving welfare access to social protection. This is especially so given the wide protection programs' exclusion, especially the significant low labor force participation rate (only 49.3%) using a widely-based data from the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) (2019). In contrast to the large number of social protection agencies in the Philippines, there is the prevalence of different types of welfare interventions for individuals who have no access to social protection programs and belong to the bottom 20 percent of households in the country as the poorest of the poor in need of government intervention. Furthermore, it is important to note the support of the state's Livelihood Empowerment Program to provide professional care the country can improve coverage of social protection programs. DP 2021-18: Social Networks and Access and Utilization of Weather and Climate Information: The Case of Upland Farming Communities in the Philippines

Social norms and structures are vital factors that guide people's behavior and outcomes. It is, therefore, useful to analyze such underlying forces in their creation of strategies that are meant to influence behavior and outcomes. Agricultural extension services such as information dissemination and hands-on training are some of the interventions that can benefit from such analyses especially within a context of limited human and financial resources. This study seeks to use the lessons learned from the analysis of social networks and norms in identifying, generating, disseminating, and information dissemination, thereby aiding the extension services. It also helps in the formulation of more contextualized approaches for reaching the underserved and hard-to-reach areas. Applying this approach, this study uses the case of a farming upland area in Mindanao (vegetable producer). This study seeks to identify the ways to develop insights for designing more effective extension strategies. The findings show that the use of information and education campaigns can be made widely by utilizing existing structures and social relations structures. PH's EV industry has strong potential for growth—PIDS study

The country's electric vehicle (EV) industry has a strong potential for growth according to a study of state-owned Philippine Institute for Development Studies (PIDS).

In a study recently organized by PIDS, Supervising Research Specialist Maureen Ara Rosellon revealed that the global outlook of the EV sector is "very optimistic" given the emerging trends that has been observed in the global EV market in terms of revenue from 2017 to 2025.

Furthermore, the number of electric cars will reach 400,000 units by 2025 in the Philippines, up from 10,000 globally. READ MORE



Failure to implement sanitary landfills due to budgetary constraints—DENR official

The non-implementation of sanitary landfills in the country is not a success, said the Undersecretary according to Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Undersecretary Benito D. Alipio during a webinar conducted by state-owned Philippine Institute for Development Studies.

"It was because of budgetary constraints that sanitary landfills were never successful. In some places, it was successful, but in majority areas of the country, it was not successful because of the limited budget," he added.

To help local government units (LGUs) with a positive outlook to fulfill the DENR program that installed sanitary landfill operation systems, he urged LGUs to start a single sanitary landfills (SLDF) program.



PBEd official highlights data sharing to address K to 12 challenges

Data sharing among stakeholders is crucial to understand the career and education aspirations of K to 12 graduates and employ, said PBEd Undersecretary.

This was according to Executive Director Cecilia M. Reyes of the Philippine Business for Education (PBE), during a virtual roundtable organized by the top think-tank Philippine Institute for Development Studies (PIDS) member of High School Graduates, Professionals and Skilled Personnel (GAPS) in the Philippines, a research organization founded in 2005 by the country's former chief executive officer and responsible to the need to "greater education and economic alignment." Restrictive procurement policies can impede PH's integration with Asia-Pacific—PIDS study

The country's restrictive policies on foreign goods participation in public procurement and trade locks in its integration with the Asia-Pacific region.

This was according to Philippine Institute for Development Studies (PIDS) Senior Research Fellow Francisco Quimon and Research Specialist Stanley O. Castro in a recent webinar jointly organized by PIDS and the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific.

Quimon and Castro, who presented the study titled "How ready are we? Measuring the Philippines' readiness for global trade integration with the Asia-Pacific," noted that three restrictions serve as a barrier to foreign and domestic procurement: foreign goods limitations, and tariff and non-tariff restrictions. Government initiatives to rehabilitate Manila Bay may be replicated at the national level, according to Marla Agas, solid waste management (SWM) focal person, Bureau of Environmental Protection (BEP), DOH. Manila Bay Clean-Up, Rehabilitation and Preservation Program.

Agas also served as a discussant during a webinar on SWM recently organized by State Link Link Philippine Institute for Development Studies (PIDS). She said that in the case of Manila Bay, 80 percent of the 11 local government units (LGUs) in the Manila Bay Area were compliant with the basic provisions of Republic Act 9103 on the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000 (RA 9103).

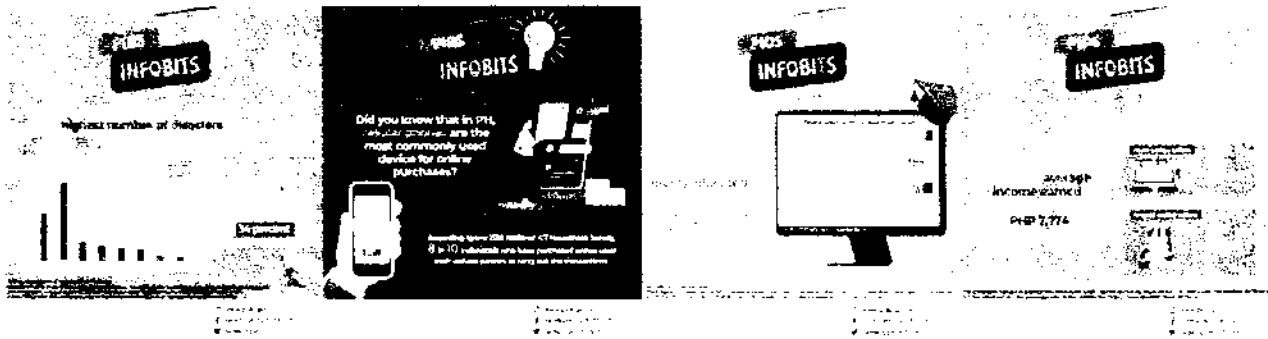

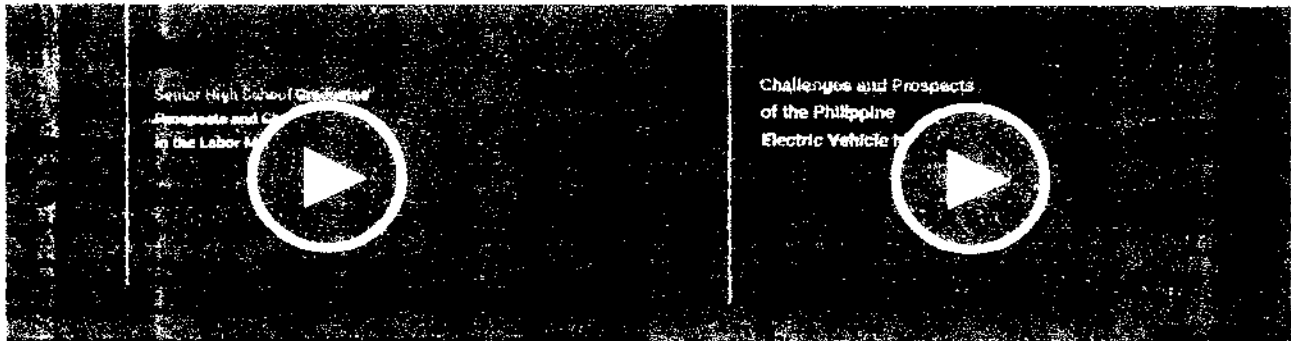
