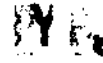

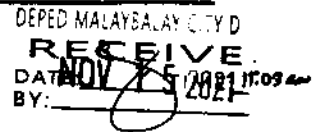

7. Demonstrates commitment or evidence that they will remain in their current jobs after the exchange program;
8. Character references and letter of endorsement and support; and
9. No previous significant travel to the U.S. on a U.S. government sponsored program.

5. Demonstrates leadership potential in their schools and/or communities;
6. Demonstrates interest in community service and outreach;
7. Commitment to implement their community service action plans, attend follow-on activities, and share their experiences with family, friends, and communities; and
8. No previous significant travel to the U.S. on a U.S. government sponsored program.
