1. Regarding the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) Memorandum No. 71, s. 2020 titled "Interim Guidelines on the Conduct of the Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) during the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Pandemic" and the implementing Rules and Regulations of RA 10121, this Office enjoins schools and offices in the Region to participate actively in the **2022 Quarterly Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill**.

 - d. understand the command and control mechanism in emergency and disaster operations at the DRRMCs.

4. Due to limitations in the conduct of mass gatherings and in adherence to the required COVID-19 health protocols, NSED exercises requiring physical interaction, **particularly evacuation drills in DepEd offices and schools, are suspended.** However, all DepEd personnel and learners shall practice the “duck, cover, and hold” procedure simultaneously at the set time.


5. Further, to raise awareness regarding the earthquake drill, DRRM coordinators shall

- a. intensify the IEC campaign by displaying earthquake preparedness measures in offices and school bulletins or through online such as social media platforms and video conferences;
- b. discuss Family Earthquake Preparedness Homework with the PTA and barangay officials for consideration in the school and community preparedness planning, as mandated in DO No. 27, s. 2015; and
- c. distribute maps containing evacuation routes and sites (at school or community) in coordination with LDRRMOs/BDRRMCs.

6. Proper documentation and post-activity evaluation are required. Hence, all offices shall make all necessary preparations so that the required reports are submitted on time. Attached are the guidelines and templates of the quarterly NSED Reports from OCD-10. Usual post-activity and documentation shall also be done for consolidation at SDO and RO levels for the DRRMS.

Rule 6, Section 7 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of the RA11013 states that "Public awareness shall also be undertaken through the conduct of drills by the DRRMC on a regular basis". Likewise, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan (NDRRMP) states that one of the activities to achieve Outcome 10, "Developed and implemented comprehensive national and local preparedness and response policies, plans and systems" is to "develop, enhance and simulate scenario-based preparedness and response plans and systems". Furthermore, one of the policy frameworks stated in the National Disaster Preparedness Plan as embedded in the fourth area of the Sendai Framework for Action 2015-2030 includes the target: to "promote regular disaster preparedness, response and recovery exercises".

The objectives are as follows:

1. To test the efficiency and usefulness of the preparedness response plans, systems and policies developed in the respective localities/offices/units.
2. To evaluate the effectiveness of contingency plan.
3. To test the coordination and communications mechanism during response operations.
4. To understand the command and control mechanism in emergency operations at the DRRMCs.

All DRRMC member agencies and Chairpersons of all LDRPMUs are enjoined to spearhead the conduct of earthquake drill in their areas of jurisdiction. In compliance with minimum public health standards, traditional forms of exercises requiring physical interaction and leading to mass gathering, particularly evacuation drills, shall no longer be conducted as part of the NSED as per NDRRMC Memorandum No. 71 s. 2020 Section 3.2.2. During the NSED proper, all stakeholders shall be enjoined to simultaneously practice the "cover, crouch, and hold" procedure on the set time. An online Exercise Evaluation Questionnaire (EEQ) shall be prepared and disseminated by the OOD after the conduct of NSED and to be answered by all public and private stakeholders who participated in the NSED. Within fifteen (15) working days after the conduct of the NSED, kindly submit after activity report to the Office of Civil Defense Regional Office 10 through electronic mail at ocdr10@disast.rmn.doe.gov.ph.



2. RATIONALE

Against the backdrop of a worldwide COVID-19 pandemic, the declaration of the State of Public Health Emergency by Presidential Proclamation No. 922 was issued. It is well established that the government's responsibility on the ongoing pandemic involves, among the continuous effort to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 virus, the State has redefined an Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) through Executive Order (EO) No. 492, s. 2020 by the issuance of RA 11469 to Bayanhan to Heal as One Act for the imposition of Community Quarantine and all its constituent agencies, offices,

While the issuance of EO No. 492 assigned certain duties on the impending issue of other natural and man-made disasters such as earthquakes, typhoons, and other geological hazards, which are also included. With the enactment of RA 11469, the assigned Disaster Preparedness and Response Act of 2020, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) has been leading the efforts to coordinate local plans to earthquakes and other geologic hazards through the interventions of disaster preparedness programs such as drills and exercises. Moreover, he stated in his Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the Act, that all such activities shall be conducted by the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (LDRRMO) in respect to preparation and public awareness.

Relatively, one of NDRRMC's national programs is the quarterly conduct of the Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSEED) under the direct facilitation of the Office of Civil Defense (OCD). The NSEED is designed and held to test the institutional capacities and individual awareness relative to earthquake preparedness drills in the country.

The issuance of the NDRRMC Memorandum No. 23, s. 2020 has not identified a standard and suggested synchronized time and date, and approaches to improve the conduct of NSEED. Alternative methods shall be considered due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Executive Order No. 49 issued by the AFP for the Management of Earthquake Operations, Rules and Regulations and guidelines to be observed during NSEED and its variations shall as the alternatives for the conduct of such operations, which will be necessary to protect the lives of citizens.

In this regard, the NDRRMC Memorandum is hereby issued as Interim Guidelines on the conduct of NSEED with the Interagency Preparedness, Response and Recovery Plan to be observed during the COVID-19 pandemic.

3. PURPOSE

The purpose of the NIOSH's "Minimum Standards for Evidence-Based Guidelines for the Control of Occupational Noise" is to provide the most up-to-date scientific information on noise control strategies to the OSHA's technical staff to improve occupational noise prevention, protection, and control.

4. GOAL

The goal of this project is to develop a comprehensive set of minimum standards for the control of occupational noise, based on the most current scientific information available.

5. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this project are to:

1. Review the current scientific information on noise control strategies and identify the most effective and feasible strategies for the control of occupational noise.
2. Develop a set of minimum standards for the control of occupational noise, based on the most current scientific information available.
3. Review the minimum standards for public and private stakeholders in occupational noise control, including the OSHA's technical staff.

6. SCOPE AND COVERAGE

This project is a review of the current scientific information on noise control strategies and the development of a set of minimum standards for the control of occupational noise. The project is limited to the control of occupational noise in the workplace and does not cover noise control strategies for the general public. The project is also limited to the control of occupational noise in the United States and does not cover noise control strategies for other countries.

7. POLICY STATEMENT

The NIOSH's "Minimum Standards for Evidence-Based Guidelines for the Control of Occupational Noise" is based on the most current scientific information available and is intended to provide the most up-to-date scientific information on noise control strategies to the OSHA's technical staff to improve occupational noise prevention, protection, and control.

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This document is the property of the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) and is not to be distributed outside of the NIOSH's technical staff.

The following definitions are provided for the purpose of this document and are not intended to be used in any other context.

3. DEFINITION OF TERMS

1. **After Action Conference (AAC)** refers to the post-incident activity that is conducted to review the After Action Review (AAR) and develop the improvement plan for an incident. This is an iterative process that improves the effectiveness of the response and is used to inform the observation and identification of hazards by AAR.
2. **After Activity Review (AAR)** refers to the written documentation that is developed to review the incident and identify the key findings related to the incident. It is used to identify the overall performance and process of the response and to develop recommendations for improvement, including, but not limited to, training, equipment, and resources for improvement.
3. **Ceremonial Pressing of the Button** refers to the symbolic gesture associated with the Incident Command System, which signifies the completion of the incident and the start of the demobilization process of the NIOSH.
4. **Circumstantial Site** refers to the location of the incident, which is not necessarily the location of the incident, but rather the location of the incident as determined by the NIOSH's member agencies in terms of standard and best practices.
5. **Conspiracy Plot** refers to the coordinated plan for a series of incidents that are intended to cause harm to the public or to the environment. It is used to describe the coordinated efforts of multiple individuals or groups to cause harm to the public or to the environment.
6. **Disaster Control Group (DCG)** refers to an organized and developed group of individuals who are trained and equipped to respond to a disaster or emergency.
7. **Disaster Preparedness** refers to the knowledge, skills, and resources developed by government, professional, and community organizations to prevent, respond to, and recover from the impacts of likely imminent or current hazards and disasters. Preparedness activities include but are not limited to the following:

9.5.2. The CDIFU shall coordinate with the EO of the CDIFU Regional Offices to coordinate the response and incident response. The CDIFU shall coordinate with the EO of the CDIFU Regional Offices to coordinate the response and incident response.

11. Post-NSED Activities:

- 11.1. Events shall be evaluated in comparison to the introduction after the issuance of NSED. Post-event debriefs shall be prepared to conduct a self-assessment and presentation of the NSED within your respective areas of jurisdiction. The ICD shall propose a self evaluation format for this purpose.
- 11.2. In the event that a self-evaluation report were being conducted, a post-event debrief shall be conducted within 30 days of the event. The ICD shall provide a template for this report. (See Article 10, Section 10.6.1 for a description of the reporting process.)
- 11.3. An online Executive Evaluation Guide (EEG) shall be prepared and distributed by the ICD and to be administered by all public and private stakeholders participating in the NSED. Within seven (7) working days after the conduct of the NSED, all ICD Regional Offices shall report to the ICD/CFE regarding the feedback received and the ICD/CFE shall have access to this feedback.
- 11.4. The ICD/CFE shall report to the National and Regional OIRMs on a quarterly basis results of the NSED over the accomplishment during ICFE during the Fall General Meeting.
- 11.5. As provided by the IA 47.0 on the Mexico Carta of Governance, all reports to be prepared as the result of the conduct of NSED shall contain any suggested future recommendations.

12. Funding:

- 12.1. All public schools, ICDs, private establishments, or associations, vehicles and other advantages are hereby approved to allocate funds and resources to support the administrative, logistical and operational requirements for the conduct of NSED and to include the ICD companies, the purchasing of CPE, the operating of presentation and response plans, and other related activities. After this time, the ICD shall coordinate with existing rules and request it.

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- 12.2. All expenses relative to the conduct of NSED and other associate activities shall be charged to the budget of the ICD. The ICD shall be responsible for the management and (if applicable) of the ICD as part of disaster requirements.

10. REPEALING CLAUSE

10.1. In the event that any provision of the present document is amended, replaced, or repealed, the provisions of this document shall remain in full force and effect.

11. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE

11.1. All essential provisions of this document shall remain in full force and effect, notwithstanding any amendment, replacement, or repeal of any provision.

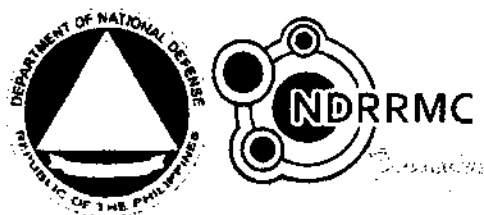
12. EFFECTIVITY
