WHEREAS, the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) released Memorandum Circular No. 2019-143 dated August 27, 2019 on the *Omnibus Guidelines for the Peace and Order Councils* which amends the composition of Local Peace and Order Councils based on Executive Order No. 773 Series of 2009, entitled *Further Reorganizing the Peace and Order Council*;

WHEREAS, in the exigency of service there is a need to reorganize and amend the membership of the City Peace and Order Council of Malaybalay;

NOW THEREFORE, I, JAY WARREN R. PABILLARAN, City Mayor of Malaybalay City, by virtue of the power vested in me by law do hereby order the reorganization of the City Peace and Order Council of Malaybalay, to wit;



Section 4. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CITY PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL.

The CPOC shall have the following duties and functions as per Memorandum Circular No. 2015-130:

- Convene the CPOC quarterly or as often as the need arises;
- 2. Invite concerned agencies not included in E.O. 773, s. 2009 (e.g. intelligence agencies) to join of participate in POC meetings and activities;
- 3. Formulate a three-year Local POC POPS Plan to be included in the CDP.
- 4. Provide a forum for inter-disciplinary dialogue and deliberation of major issues and concerns affecting peace, order, and public safety nationwide;
- 5. Recommend strategic actions or activities aimed at promoting, improving or enhancing measures, within their respective jurisdictions;
- 6. Recommend measures to converge and orchestrate internal security operations efforts of civil authorities and agencies, military, and police;
- Formulate and adopt an effective mechanism for the coordination, cooperation, and consultation involving the local executives, citizenry, and law enforcement agencies under Republic Act No, 6975, as amended, in the adoption of the Community and Serviceoriented Policing (CSOP) System;
- 8. Apply moral suasion and/or recommend sanctions against local chief executives who are giving material or political support to the insurgents;
- Monitor the provision of livelihood and infrastructure development programs and projects in the remote rural and indigenous population areas to isolate them from the insurgents' ideological, political and organizational works;
- 10. Create a Special Action Committee to address the immediate issues on peace and order and public safety, in case of emergencies;
- 11. Create a Technical Working Group for the purpose of POPS Planning, following the guidelines prescribed by the DILG on the tools and processes on POPS Planning;
- 12. Submit semestral POC Accomplishment Reports to the National POC through the respective POC Secretariats;
- 13. Serve as the convergence mechanism to support Enhance Comprehensive Local Integration Program (E-CLIP) Committee in its implementation at the Provincial POC level;
- 14. Support the implementation of ELCAC initiatives;
- 15. Participate in the conduct of annual POC performance audit;
- 16. Provide staff and financial support to the POC Secretariat;
- 17. Perform other functions that may be directed by law, the National Peace and Order Council, or the President.

Section 5. PEACE AND ORDER COUNCIL SECRETARIAT. There shall be Peace and Order Council Secretariat which shall handle the administrative and technical activities the of Peace and Order Council. The secretariat shall also undertake liaising and coordination of activities with the appropriate agencies of the government.

The CLGOO of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) shall head the CPOC secretariat.

The Secretariat shall be assisted in its functions and duties by the regular staff of the council chairman.

Section 6. MEETINGS. The Council shall meet on a regular basis on the first Thursday of the third month of each quarter.

Section 7. AUTOMATIC ASSUMPTION. Should any member of the City Peace and Order Council cease to hold his/her office by reason of permanent incapacity, removal, resignation or the likes, the person who succeeded or appointed in the particular office/position shall automatically become a member thereof.

Section 8. REPEALING CLAUSE. All prior issuances on the organization and functions of the Peace and Order Council inconsistent herewith shall be deemed superseded by this order.

Section 9. EFFECTIVITY. This Order shall take effect immediately.
