MANDATORY UNANNOUNCED EARTHQUAKE AND FIRE DRILLS IN SCHOOLS

To: Undersecretaries
 Assistant Secretaries
 Minister, Basic, Higher, and Technical Education, BARMM
 Bureau, Service and Regional Directors
 Schools Division/City Superintendents
 Public Elementary and Secondary School Heads

1. Located within the seismically active Pacific "Ring of Fire", the Philippines is prone to natural disasters and earthquakes. These natural hazards, coupled with vulnerabilities, increase the risk of disasters in schools and communities.
2. Aside from natural disasters, man-made catastrophes also pose serious risks and threats to the safety and security of the students, teachers, and other school personnel.
3. Emergencies and calamities may strike anywhere and anytime. Thus, having an effective preparedness plan is the key in preventing disasters and saving lives. Accordingly, local drills and simulation exercises are preventive measures that familiarize escape routes and reinforce proper actions in the occurrence of a calamity. Frequent practice of these drills and exercises would eventually turn these actions into automatic reflexes that would manifest during an actual calamity.
4. Pursuant to Republic Act (RA) No. 10121 entitled The Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010, which promotes the development of capacities in disaster management at the individual, organizational, and institutional levels; aligned with the Department's commitment of ensuring the safety and well-being of its learners and school personnel, all public schools are hereby required to conduct **unannounced earthquake and fire drills every first and third week of every month.**
5. The School Heads, with the assistance of School Disaster and Risk Reduction Management Coordinators, shall spearhead the planning, implementation, and regular monitoring of these drills in their respective schools. These drills are to ensure that all learners are properly guided on what should be done during and after an earthquake or occurrences of fire in schools.
6. All schools in the National Capital Region, Rizal, Cavite, Laguna, and Bulacan, shall create a separate and specific disaster plan for a magnitude 7 or higher

earthquake. The plan shall specifically lay down the response should there be a scenario involving mass casualties of learners and personnel.

7. Schools shall refer to DepEd Order (DO) No. 27, s. 2015 titled Promoting Family Earthquake Preparedness, for materials that may be used by learners and their families as guide in the preparation before, during, and after the occurrence of an earthquake.
8. Private schools, community learning centers, as well as state/local universities and colleges (SUCs/LUCs) may choose to adopt the provisions of this DO as basis in the conduct of their own earthquake and fire drills for the disaster preparedness of their students.
9. Immediate dissemination of and strict compliance with this Order is directed.

Pursuant to DepEd Order (DO) No. 53, s. 2022 titled Mandatory Unannounced Earthquake and Fire Drills in Schools, requiring all public elementary and secondary schools to conduct unannounced earthquake and fire drills every first and third week of every month, the Office of the Undersecretary for Operations (OUOPS) provides the enclosed DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2022 Implementing Guidelines.

The enclosed Implementing Guidelines are based on the agreements made during the coordination meeting with the regional DRRM Coordinators on the implementation of DO 53, s. 2022 held last January 11, 2023 via Zoom conference call. Further, the regional DRRM Coordinators shall cascade and provide guidance to the division DRRM Coordinators on the implementation of DO 53, s. 2022.

**Implementing Guidelines of the DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2022 or the
Mandatory Unannounced Earthquake and Fire Drills in Schools**

I. Schedule of the Mandatory Unannounced Earthquake and Fire Drills

The mandatory unannounced earthquake and fire drills shall be conducted twice monthly, during the first and third week of each month. The conduct of the drill shall take no more than one (1) hour to ensure the minimal disruption of classes. Kindly refer to the following table for mapping of the first and third weeks of the month for CY 2023:

The School Heads, with their respective school DRRM teams, shall determine the specific days that their school shall conduct the drills. The proposed schedule of the drills shall be communicated to the Schools Division Offices through the school DRRM coordinator.

The said drills under DepEd Order 53, s. 2022 shall be implemented separately from the quarterly Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) The drills shall be conducted on a different day that the NSED is carried out.

For cases where there is conflict with the schedules of equally important school activities, such as but not limited to, quarterly examinations and the National Achievement test, the Schools Division Office shall determine the next best available schedule for the conduct of the drills and shall communicate these changes to their respective Regional Office. The Regional Offices shall communicate these changes to the DRRMS.

11. Involved Personnel and Stakeholders

The Regional Directors and the Schools Division Superintendents shall ensure that their respective DRRM coordinators receive the required assistance from the other concerned divisions and units of their office.

The School Heads, with their school DRRM team shall enjoin the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) of their schools pursuant to Section 9 - Duties and Responsibilities of PTA Members of DepEd Order 13, s. 2022 titled Omnibus Guidelines on the Regulation of Operations of Parent-Teacher Associations to provide support to the school in the planning and conduct of the drills as stipulated by DO 53, s. 2022.

III. Special Considerations

For schools located near coastlines and flood prone areas, the drills shall not require the learners and school personnel to evacuate to the mainland or higher ground.

For schools located in highly dense urban areas, the drills shall not require learners and school personnel to evacuate to predetermined evacuation sites which are far away from school premises.

IV. Administrative Guidelines

The Schools Division Offices are advised to refer to their respective Earthquake and Fire Contingency Plans with respect to the involvement of their local governments (city, municipality, barangay) and local partners, such as but not limited to, the Bureau of Fire Protection and non-government organizations to ensure the successful and well-coordinated implementation of DepEd Order 53, s. 2022.

The School Heads are instructed to conduct formal briefings of their teaching and non-teaching personnel, as well as their parent-teacher associations, regarding the schedule and implementation of the drills.

Due to the nature of the drills being unannounced, the schools are advised to revisit their Earthquake and Fire Contingency Plans to ensure that unnecessary panic and untoward incidents are avoided and/or managed, and that there are zero casualties and injuries caused by these drills.

V. Monitoring

All schools, schools division offices, and regional offices shall strictly follow the guidelines below.

- i) Report on the Conduct of Unannounced Earthquake and Fire Drill – School-level Monitoring Template
- ii) Division Consolidated Report on the Conduct of Unannounced Earthquake and Fire Drill – Division-level Monitoring Template
- iii) Regional Consolidated Report on The Conduct of Unannounced Earthquake and Fire Drill – Regional-level Monitoring Template

Report Consolidation and Submission Schedule

1. The School DRRM Coordinator shall accomplish the School Level Monitoring Template after every conduct of the drills and submit the accomplished template no later than the Tuesday of the second week (for the first week of the month drills) and the Tuesday of the fourth week (for the third week of the month drills) of the month to their Division DRRM Coordinator. For drill weeks that are rescheduled to a different week, the deadline will be adjusted to the Tuesday of the following week.
2. The Division DRRM Coordinator shall consolidate the school-level reports using the Division-level Monitoring Template and shall submit to the regional office through the Regional DRRM Coordinator no later than three (3) working days after the school level report submission deadline.
3. The Regional DRRM Coordinator shall consolidate the division-level reports using the Regional-level Monitoring Template and shall submit to the DRRMS via email at drmo@deped.gov.ph. Kindly refer to the following table for the schedule of the monthly regional consolidated report submissions:
