

Greetings!

Thank you for accommodating us in our courtesy visit with you in November 2023 and for your continuous support in the implementation of the ChildFund BuildCA²P project. It aims to sustain efforts to support DepEd in our six (6) assisted schools in the Division of Malaybalay City to address child labor concerns.

Since 2021 we have consistently provided school supplies to those children engaged and at risk of child labor that we intake during baseline in 2019-2020. While transitioning from blended learning to a face-to-face teaching mode, we provided equipment (TV and printer) and various supplies to augment the needs for remedial classes when these schools were still transitioning from the blended mode of teaching.

In July 2023, we conducted training for teachers on the crafting of a localized Child Protection Policy. It was participated by 7 participants (6 school heads and 1 PSDS) from Malaybalay City namely *Tuburan IS, Mapulo ES, Silae NHS, Silae ES, Kibalabag ES, and Pighalugan ES.* Last August 2023, the project distributed 635 school kits to assist children of the BuildCA²P project.

Along this line, we would like to inform you that we will request updates from the said schools on the following:

- 1. Number of attendees on remedial classes for SY2023-2024 (attached is the suggested template). Our funder (US Dept. of Labor) normally asks for updates on this matter.
- 2. Status on the preparation of the Child Protection Policy (CPP) for us to know how we can further support its finalization.
- 3. Related to these, the project team will conduct monitoring of the use of supplies and equipment that we provided as part of our regular updating. Please see the attached monitoring form.
