





The National Book Development Board (NBDB), an attached agency of the Department of Education (DepEd), will conduct the **Philippine Book Festival (PBF) 2024** to gather publishers, creators, and readers of books and contents at the World Trade Center Metro Manila, Pasay City on **April 25 to 28, 2024.**

In view of this, the DepEd, through the Bureau of Learning Resources (BLR), is inviting teachers and non-teaching personnel, learners, parents, and other DepEd stakeholders to participate in the said event.

Likewise, the support and engagement on the said event of all Region and Schools Division Office (SDO) are also requested through the following:

- 1. The issuance of a Regional Memorandum inviting, promoting, and encouraging the participation of all interested DepEd personnel, as well as other interested stakeholders i.e. learners and their parents or guardians, to join this book experience on the **weekend schedules**;
- 2. Allowing learning resource (LR) public school personnel, like those involved in the identification and selection of storybooks, big books, and other literary and supplementary learning resources (SLRs) for school libraries, to attend the book fair activities on dates that fall on a Friday and/or weekend; and
- 3. Allowing Regional or Schools Division Office learning resource personnel to attend the book fair activities on dates that fall on a Friday and/or weekend.

Being among the primary interested stakeholders in the book publishing industry, the DepEd and its personnel will be treated with exclusive activities, as reflected on the attached PBF Schedule of Activities. PHILIPPINE BOOK FESTIVAL BRIEFER


I. General information

The Philippine Book Festival (PBF) is the most prominent traveling book festival in the country carrying mostly Filipino content, a one-of-a-kind book fair that melds education, entertainment, tourism, and shopping for the entire family. It's not just a book fair, it's a book experience!

It aims to celebrate literature, culture, and the arts in the Philippines; provide a platform for publishers, writers, and readers to come together and showcase their works, share ideas, and engage in discussions and activities related to literature and the arts; promote literacy and reading; encourage the development of the Philippine publishing industry; and showcase the richness and diversity of Philippine literature and culture.

It hopes to provide the stakeholders of Republic Act 8047 a "home" to know, support, and understand the book publishing industry and the NBDB.

The PBF was originally conceptualized to provide the Department of Education (DepEd) with an opportunity to scope and evaluate materials for the procurement of learning resources for public school libraries and library hubs. Through the National Book Development Board's (NBDB) partnership with the DepEd's Bureau of Learning Resources and with the support of DepEd officials Undersecretary Gina O. Gonong, Assistant Secretary Alma Ruby Torio, Director Ariz Delson Acay Cawilan, and Director Edward Jimenez; an estimated PHP 2B will be spent for the procurement of said materials in 2024.



II. PBF 2023

Last year, the festival had over **50,000** attendees, including around **1,000** members of DepEd's Supplementary Learning Resources Technical Working Group from all over the country, who attended to scope out the market. The fair featured **170** exhibitor booths and **7** exhibitions, such as the *Rare Books Collection of the National Library of the Philippines, Ang INK, History of Komiks, Book Nook, Ang Mundo ni Trese, DepEd Matatag, SLT, and CulturAid Indigenous Communities.* There were also over **160** events on capacity building, meet and greet sessions, and book launchings.

The total retail sales generated from the Manila leg exceeded **PHP 60M**. The information on the sales for the Davao leg, on the other hand, is yet to be available. There is also no data available on the number of titles showcased or books sold as the metric used is based on total sales.



The majority of PBF attendees were female. The age group with the most attendees, on the other hand, was 25 to 34 years old. Average spending reached as much as PHP 1,500.00 while average food spending exceeded PHP 300.00.



Unfortunately, there is no tool available to measure feedback from the public except for social media engagement during the fair. Below is the engagement rate during PBF Manila held from June 2 to 4, 2023.

There is also no available information on the PBF feedback from other government agencies. However, the PBF was instrumental in the passing of DepEd Orders—and , s. 2023, which outlined the procedures for the "Provision of Supplementary Learning Resources (SLRs) for Public School Libraries and Library Hubs" and the "Procurement and Quality Assurance of Textbooks (TXs) and Teacher's Manuals (TMs)." These initiatives address the urgent need to enhance literacy rates and eliminate delays caused by subpar learning materials.

III. PBF 2024

For the PBF's second year, the NBDB and its partners invite everyone to "dive in" to the sea of knowledge, imagination, and stories, and discover the wonders of Philippine literature, culture, and content.

Just like its preceding year, the fair will bring back its four realms: **Kid Lit** (a land just for kids), **Komiks** (Pinoy komiks), **Booktopia** (fiction and non-fiction titles), and **Aral Akiat** (educational textbook and materials).

This year's PBF will be extended for an additional day to cater to institutional buyers such as the DepEd, private schools, libraries, and cross-media buyers. The event will continue to support the DepEd and private publishers in procuring supplementary learning materials for public libraries and the National Reading Program while remaining open to the general public for retail purchases and other activities. Additionally, there will be additional sessions on reading book leveling and reading remediation to aid in learning recovery and translation processes of literary works.

The programming for the four-day event which includes the list of VIPs and featured authors, exhibitions, events, and other attractions, is yet to be finalized.

The factors that will be considered for the fair to be a success will be the number of visitors, business matchings produced, exhibitors, and total sales, among others.





IV. About the NBDB

The National Book Development Board (NBDB) is responsible for promoting a culture of reading and developing the publishing industry in the Philippines. The agency works with various stakeholders in the publishing value chain, including content creators, publishers, government agencies, and consumers.

As the leading catalyst for building a culture of reading and authorship, the NBDB aims to create an environment that fosters the growth of the book publishing industry and ensures an adequate and accessible supply of quality books, not just for the local market, but worldwide. To achieve its goals, the NBDB collaborates with both local and international organizations to promote the publication, sales of rights, distribution, and translation of high-quality works of Filipino creatives.

While the NBDB has made significant progress in delivering its mandate, the agency has encountered a few roadblocks along the way, which the PBF aims to address by:

Concern	Solution
Multiple processes in the government's procurement of educational materials	The PBF was able to consolidate multiple processes in the government book procurement process by bringing DepEd, the largest buyer of educational resources, and the Philippine publishing industry together in one venue. Instead of contacting multiple publishing enterprises separately, the PBF provided a viable commercial outlet.
Children barely read	Through the PBF's Kid Lit realm, families and children can discover new titles that not only spark their curiosity but also bring them closer together through the joy of reading.
Lack of access to Pinoy books	Children may turn to other activities instead of reading due to the lack of books available in their vernacular. To address this issue, the PBF offers a platform where industry creatives from all over the country can market and sell their books, thus making them more widely accessible to visitors.
Lack of fun, family-friendly edutainment activities	The PBF offers a staggering lineup of events, such as meet-and-greets, book signings, live performances by actors and storytellers, talks and workshops, and discussions and debates.



The PBF also provides industry creatives with a venue to build networks and potentially unlock business opportunities.

- This initiative, which started more than eight years ago, is a collaborative undertaking of the Republic of the Philippines and the Office of Senate President Pro Tempore Loren Legarda, the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA), the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) and the National Book Development Board (NBDB).
